We give our very busy Stated Clerk a small break by having a member of Presbytery Council write an article on a regular basis. We are grateful to the Rev. <u>Matt</u> <u>Schramm</u> for his contribution this week. Matt is the Senior Pastor of <u>Midland-Memorial</u> and the Vice Moderator of Presbytery.

I have a grand total of one wrestling win in my athletic career. I won't mention how many losses, but it's more than one. It was a long time ago — long enough that I wrestled in the 112 pound division — and I only lasted a year. That can probably be attributed to this truth about wrestling that I won't forget: it is hard and it is painful. I heard an interview with a wrestling coach who said that among other things, wrestling is intimate and confrontational.

At MPC we've been studying some of our heritage from the Hebrew Scriptures, including Jacob. Jacob's story has its ups and downs; but, eventually, we come to know him as Israel - One who wrestles with God.

As Christians, our ancestors were the people of Israel. In some spiritual sense, we still bear that name. And we do well to remember it is who we are to be wrestling with God. We pursue an opportunity to have a intimate and confrontational relationship with the one who created and redeemed us, who hears us when we cry out for justice, who knows us better than we know ourselves, and who loves us anyway.

In the Scriptures, over and over we read of God's people wrestling with God. That holds true from the very beginning and is seen even in the life of Jesus, who shares an intimate and confrontational relationship with his Father. God summons us to that sort of relationship, too. In the first chapter of Isaiah, we hear God's invitation to "come now, let us argue it out" as we work with God to seek justice for all (Isaiah 1:1-18 NRSV).

The life of discipleship is not a walk in the park. It's often a wrestling match. Our congregations and our presbytery are not where the wrestling stops and all is well. Instead, we remind one another that we are not alone as we wrestle with who we are called to be as the people of God. We won't be perfect, but may we be found faithful. God be with you as you seek to serve
