ORIGINS OF VALENTINE DAY

Many centuries ago, February 14 was designated as the annual celebration of Valentine Day. There is a lot of information to consider when writing a history of Valentine Day. I will be providing here, only what is said to be the Christian origins of Valentine Day. For after all, we are Christians.

Valentine Day began as Saint Valentine's Day or the Feast of Saint Valentine. This feast was established in the 5th century by Pope Gelasius I of the Roman Catholic Church, to honor one or two Christian saints named Valentinus who were martyred, or executed, on February 14th, as punishment for sharing the message of Jesus.

There were actually three saints by the name of Valentine or Valentinus. Two of them were from Italy. And one was from Africa. Two died by being beheaded, the third was only said to have been executed.

One story about this man Valentine is that he was a priest of the church who was imprisoned for assisting Christians who were being persecuted by the Roman Empire. While Valentine was in prison, he fell in love with a young woman (Some said she was the jailer's daughter) and wrote and sent to her a farewell letter (Calling it: "From your Valentine") before he was executed. One version of the story said that the young woman was blind, and Valentine healed her.

Another Valentine story says Valentine was beheaded for conducting secret wedding ceremonies for Roman soldiers who were Christians, when the Roman Emperor had outlawed Christian weddings for their young soldiers.

How Valentine's Day became connected with romantic love is traced to a poem written in the year 1375 by the Englishman Geoffrey Chaucer, describing the mating of birds in mid February. Chaucer claimed that on Saint Valentine Day every bird chose their mates. Perhaps this is where we get our term "love birds." About that time, couples expressed their love to each other by giving flowers, candles and cards.

Valentine Day is a great opportunity to celebrate love for family, friends, spouses, lovers, or neighbors because our Lord Jesus taught that people would know us by our love. Jesus said: "A new commandment I give you, that you love one another; just as I loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:34-35)

Ground Hog Day Fun Facts

When is Groundhog Day 2025? Date, traditions, and fun facts to know

Will he or won't he? Every Feb. 2, the question arises - will the groundhog see his shadow, prompting six more weeks of winter? The most popular of the rodent meteorologists is Punxsutawney Phil, a western Pennsylvania-based groundhog that draws scores of people to the small town each February.

Here is everything to know about the prophetic rodent and the day dedicated to his winter forecast.

When is Groundhog Day?

It's always on Feb. 2, which in 2025 lands on a Sunday. Punxsutawney Phil - as well as other groundhog predictors around the nation - will predict the forecast early in the morning. (Typically around 7:30 a.m.)

What is Groundhog Day?

In the American tradition of Groundhog Day, the nation's groundhog prognosticators take a stance on the season ahead. If the groundhog sees his shadow, he predicts six more weeks of winter. If he doesn't, it's a forecast of an early spring.

Groundhog Day's roots are in the Christian holiday <u>Candlemas</u>, the midway point between the winter solstice and spring equinox. Candlemas was traditionally aligned with the anticipation of planting crops, according to the <u>Old Farmer's Almanac</u>, and seeing sunshine on the day was said to indicate winter's return.

In Europe, people traditionally looked to bears or badgers to look for the sign of returning winter or coming spring, but when German immigrants arrived in Pennsylvania, they instead used groundhogs to make the forecast instead.

The first official Groundhog Day took place on <u>February 2, 1887</u>, in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania. The event took up permanent residence at Gobbler's Knob the following year.

Who is Punxsutawney Phil?

Punxsutawney Phil is the famous groundhog who predicts the weather in "Groundhogese," according to the Punxsutawney Groundhog Club. He is not the only weather-predicting rodent, but he is the best known. He is also known as the "Seers of Seers," the "Prognosticator of Prognosticators," "Weather Predictor Extraordinaire," "Br'er Groundhog" and "National Treasure."

Tens of thousands of people flock to the town to witness the ceremony in person. More than 30,000 people attend the event each year, according to <u>visitpa.com</u>, Pennsylvania's state-run tourism website.

Did Phil see his shadow last year? Was he right?

In 2024, <u>Phil predicted we would see an early spring.</u> According to groundhog-day.com, nearly all the American groundhogs also predicted an early spring.

How accurate is Punxsutawney Phil?

While Phil is the most famous groundhog, he isn't the most accurate. According to <u>Stormfax Weather Almanac</u>, Phil is only right around 39% of the time.

Ohio's groundhog, Buckeye Chuck, for example has an accuracy record closer to <u>75%</u>, according to the Marion Star, a newspaper in central Ohio that is part of the USA TODAY Network.

For a forecast that's far more than folklore, visit the National Weather Service or AccuWeather.

What other groundhogs offer a Feb. 2 forecast?

Sure Punxsutawney Phil is the best known groundhog, but he's not the only one. A lesser-known taxidermied groundhog - Octoraro Orphie from Lancaster County, Pennsylvania - was the groundhog I was raised to defer to. But there are others around the nation with far more clout.
