What Is the Meaning and Purpose of Lent

Lent signifies a solemn 40-day period preceding Easter. Commencing on Ash Wednesday and concluding on Holy Saturday, Lent is characterized by fasting, prayer, and repentance as believers prepare for the celebration of Easter Sunday. This season of reflection and self-discipline involves practices such as abstaining from certain indulgences, fostering a deeper spiritual connection, and commemorating the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

What are the Key Date of Lent?

Lent starts with Ash Wednesday, the day when you might see people with a cross of ashes on their foreheads. These ashes are a reminder of our need for repentance and the reality of our human frailty. Palm Sunday follows, marking Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem, when people welcomed Him with palm branches, recognizing Him as their King. Maundy Thursday remembers the Last Supper, when Jesus shared a final meal with His disciples and demonstrated humility by washing their feet.

Good Friday is a solemn day that commemorates Jesus' crucifixion and His ultimate sacrifice for our sins. Despite its sorrowful events, it's called "Good" because of the redemption Jesus secured for us. Holy Saturday is a day of quiet reflection, as we remember Jesus' time in the tomb and anticipate the joy of what's to come. Finally, Easter Sunday bursts forth with celebration—Jesus is alive! His resurrection offers us hope, new life, and the promise of eternity with Him.

Why is Lent 40 days? The 40-day period of Lent is symbolic of significant biblical events, including:

- Jesus' 40 days of fasting and temptation in the wilderness (<u>Matthew 4:1-11</u>).
- Moses spending 40 days on Mount Sinai receiving the Ten Commandments (Exodus <u>34:28</u>).
- Elijah's 40-day journey to Mount Horeb (<u>1 Kings 19:8</u>).
- The 40 days of rain during the Great Flood (<u>Genesis 7:12</u>).
- The Israelites' 40 years of wandering in the desert (<u>Numbers 14:33</u>).

The meaning of Lent revolves around preparation, reflection, and penance. During Lent, Christians honor the 40 days and nights following Christ's baptism when He went into the wilderness without water and food and was tempted by Satan. During that time, Christ did what we do today when we fast: wrestle with temptation. This was not the first fast; biblical figures often fasted when petitioning God for something important. "So we fasted and implored our God [...], and he listened to our entreaty" (Ezra 8:23). The Israelites "mourned and wept and fasted till evening for Saul and his son Jonathan, and for the army of the LORD and for the nation of Israel, because they had fallen by the sword" (<u>2 Samuel 1:12</u>).


